

Bert Boeckmann enters Ford Hall of Fame

Bert Boeckmann, TVEA Boardmember and CEO of Galpin Motors, has become the first inductee to enter Ford Motor Co.'s Top Volume Dealer Hall of Fame. Bert is also one of the founders of TVEA.

"When I talk to employees, I say we are here to serve our customers," Boeckmann said. He was recognized by the car maker with a visit to Galpin Ford by Mark LaNeve, Vice President of U.S. marketing and a luncheon for employees.

The hall of fame recognizes a select group of Ford dealers who have been the principal manager at a high-performing dealership for 25 or more years and are known as outstanding retailers and community leaders.

Galpin Ford has been the best-selling Ford dealership by volume in the world for 27 years running, as well as having top-selling Honda, Mazda and Volkswagen dealerships.

The 86-year old's career began when he worked for Frank Galpin at his Ford Dealership in the San Fernando Valley. Since then, his motivation has been that he enjoys people. "The relationships you develop with people andd those that I work with have made for a wonderful life," explained Boeckmann, who still puts in 40 hours a week at the dealership.
