Adult Education

- Noncredit certificates are short-term vocational programs that develop specialized skills in an industry sector and for an entry-level occupation (18 to 36 hours)
- **No cost to the student**
- Noncredit classes are no-cost to the student. In addition, the classes are “open-entry open-exit” allowing students to enroll and exit the course at any time.
- Because the grading structure is Passing (P), Satisfactory Progress (SP), and No Pass (NP) does not affect student’s grade point average.
- Allow students to access campus resources and services (i.e., Basic Needs Center, Family Resource Center, Dream Center, and academic advising)

Employer Trainings: Noncredit – Vocational Education

- Noncredit programs must be a minimum of two classes (18 hours)
- Developed by a faculty/department and employer
- Funded through college state apportionment
- **Reduce training cost for employers**

Job Training Academies

- Job training are short-term trainings (six weeks) that provide technical training, soft skills development, and job placement assistance in entry-level occupations..
- Job training are at no cost to the student, funded by grant funds.
- Participants receive a certificate on completion and a guaranteed interview with an employer.
- Work closely with work source centers and community-based organization to students.
- **Guaranteed interview with an employer**

Apprenticeships

- Governor Gavin Newsom's push to expand apprenticeship system to serve 500,000 apprentices by 2029.
- An apprenticeship is an education and employment model that allows students the opportunity to earn a living wage while acquiring technical skills, professional experiences, and a credential.
- **Pipeline of talent for employers, especially in highly-specialized occupations or understaffed workforces.**
- A Pre-Apprenticeship is a training programs that prepare students for apprenticeships.



Apprenticeships

- LAVC was awarded \$120,000 California Apprenticeship Innovation Grant to plan and register a Community Health Worker Pre-Apprenticeship and Apprenticeship Program
- Applying for the CAI Implementation Grant
- Governor Newsom's advancement of initiatives to bring 25,000 new CHWs to California by 2025, as well as a new CHW MediCal (Medicaid) benefit which became effective in January 2022
- **CAI Planning Grant due Jan. 15th (Great opportunities for employers who want to explore using the apprenticeship model to train employees and increase workforce).**
